# A joint message from DANA President & Board Chair

In 2018, DANA saw positive signs in the nonprofit sector. The economy continued to strengthen, state government funding to grants-in-aid was restored, and nonprofits focused on improving their viability and impact across the state of Delaware.

Last year, we had record requests for consulting support, great attendance in our workshops, and fabulous participation in our advocacy events and social media video campaigns. Collectively, our voice became stronger as we worked together to advance issues that affect our work. With Philanthropy Delaware, DANA launched ShareDelaware.org, a mapping database of nonprofits providing services in Delaware. This unique resource profiles where nonprofits offer services, not just where they are headquartered. Ten years of financial data provide an easy way to review nonprofits' financial health. We're grateful to all who helped update their information and to members who completed the December 2018 survey, which gives us feedback on how we are serving Delaware nonprofits. Our efforts to shift programming to meet member needs seem to be well-received. Highlights from the survey are featured in this annual report.

As we move through 2019, we continue to seek ways to bring new services and learning opportunities to our members. We are meeting with legislators and imparting the need for increased government investment in Delaware's nonprofit sector. We see tenured leaders of nonprofits announcing retirements, and we are increasing our services to support nonprofit boards with succession planning. Our focus will shift to offering more online learning opportunities. DANA also made a commitment to raise awareness for increased diversity in nonprofit boards and in leadership. We will continue this work into 2020.

Our efforts to expand resources for our members are not just focused on the short term. A complete count for the 2020 census plays a critical role in the level of federal funding for community services. DANA was appointed by the governor to serve on the Complete Count Commission. We are thrilled to assist in this important initiative.

The DANA board of directors is also initiating its strategic planning. The perspectives of nonprofits, business and government leaders will offer key insights to our planning. This year, we will collect feedback on plans to improve the health of the nonprofit sector. This information will shape DANA's strategy for the next several years. We look forward to your participation.

# DANA Impacts Clear Space Theatre Company, Rehoboth Beach, DE

**Our Mission:** To inspire audiences, artists and students by providing quality performances and educational experiences.

**Our Vision:** To be a leader in the vibrant performing arts community of Southern Delaware.

#### **Our Story:**

Clear Space Theatre Company began in 2004 with two theater professionals who wanted to provide live theater to the Rehoboth Beach community. In the 15 years since, Clear Space has grown from a community theater into a professional theater impacting all of Southern Delaware.

Clear Space Acting Company produces about 150 professional performances each year for the enjoyment of more than 17,000 patrons. Clear Space Performing Arts Institute trains more than 500 students each year in acting, voice and more.





### **How DANA Supports Us:**

DANA has supported Clear Space in our transition in the past seven years from a founder-based organization to a sustainable and independent organization. DANA was by our side as we focused our vision, developed our board of directors and moved to a more traditional form of nonprofit board governance. With DANA's training, we updated bylaws and created a Board Duty and Responsibility Form.

DANA President Sheila Bravo led a retreat for us that outlined responsibilities within an organization. She taught us how to implement the Responsible, Accountable, Consulted and Informed model so that our board and staff have a clear understanding of their duties in our organization. DANA's staff has proven to be a great resource, answering all of our strategy-related questions.

DANA has been a partner in the growth of Clear Space Theatre with consulting and training in the past decade. As we move forward, the DANA staff will continue to be an excellent resource to help expand the cultural impact of Clear Space.

# DANA Impacts Campus Community School, Dover, DE

**Our Mission:** To provide a world class education that develops the whole child and provides the educational foundations for all students to maximize their potential.

**Our Vision:** To provide excellence in educational outcomes for CCS students by creating an academically rigorous, safe, and caring environment.

#### **Our Story:**

Campus Community School (CCS) opened in 1998 as a 1st-8th grade charter school. It now serves grades K-8. The charter calls for social constructivist teaching and learning, as well as the incorporation of Habits of Mind: persistence, reflection, self-direction, and citizenship.

CCS is a Responsive Classroom school and has adopted the following guiding principles:

- Teaching social and emotional skills is as important as teaching academic content.
- How we teach is as important as what we teach.
- Great cognitive growth occurs through social interaction.
- What we know and believe about our students—individually, culturally, developmentally—informs our expectations, reactions, and attitudes about those students.





- How we work together as adults to create a safe, joyful, and inclusive school environment is as important as our individual contribution or competence.
- Partnering with families—knowing them and valuing their contributions—is as important as knowing the children we teach.

#### **How DANA Supports Us:**

DANA has helped us become more informed about expectations and best practices for school boards related to finances, legal matters, and overall structure and organization. It has helped us examine our practices for recruiting and selecting new board members.

I think DANA is a great resource to help organizations, and the people within them, to better themselves. I like that DANA presents pertinent information and incorporates reflection and analysis in its training. This aspect makes the experience more personalized and meaningful.
